We apologise for any disappointment this may cause, and look forward to holding our next Christmas Tree Festival in December 2026.





Benefice News

Dear friends.

As you may know, Revd Simon has now left the benefice to take up his new calling in Essex. This marks the beginning of what the Church of England calls an *interregnum* — a period between the departure of one vicar and thearrival of another. While the Latin roots of the wor mean "between reigns," please be assured that this is not a time when the life of the Church stops! Our group of parishes continues in worship, prayer, and service to the community, eve without a resident vicar.

What does an interregnum mean for us?

During this time, the day -to-day life of the parish will be overseen by the churchwardens, supported by the PCC (Parochial Church Council), the Rural Dean and other clergy within the benefice. Services will continue, often led by visiting clergy, retired ministers, and our own sel supporting clergy and licensed lay ministers. Baptisms, weddings, and funerals will still be conducted, though sometimes with a little more coordination needed. Pastoral care remains a priority, with the ministry team and churchwardens ensuring that noone is left without support It's worth remembering that an interregnum can also be a valuable season for reflection — a chance to pray, to discern God's guidance, and to consider the kind of ministry our benefice needs for the future.

The process of appointing a new vicar

The appointment of a new incumbent follows a clearly defined process. Here's a brief outline of what will happen:

- The Benefice Profile The PCCs from each parish in the benefice will work together to prepare a *Parish Profile*. This document describes our churches, congregations, communities, and aspirations for the future. It will also outline the qualities we are looking for in a new vicar.
- **2** The Vacancy Advert Once the profile is agreed and approved by the Bishop and the Patron(s) of the benefice, the post will be advertised nationally (usually via the Church of England and diocesan websites).
- 3 **Shortlisting and Interviews** Applications are reviewed jointly by the Bishop 's representative, the Patron(s), and parish representatives from within the benefice. A shortlist is drawn up, and candidates are invited to interview.
- 4 **Appointment and Announcement** When a candidate is chosen and accepts the post, there is a formal announcement in church and the community. The new vicar will usually arrive a few months later, after completing their responsibilities in their current parish.
- 5 **Licensing and Induction** The Bishop will lead a special service to license ad induct the new incumbent, marking the beginning of their ministry among us.

Our part in this process

The most important thing we can do during this time is to pray — for our churchwardens, PCCs, the Bishop, the Patron(s), and for the person God is calling to serve here next. Let us also continue to support one another, welcome newcomers, and play our part in the life of the church.

Many of you will ask what my part in this process is, and to be honest - I don't have one. My time in my current post, which is of course a training post, is limited and so in due course it will be for me to start the process of ending my curacy, being signed off as a 'fully fledged parish vicar' and start looking for where God is calling me to serve my next season of missitry. Do, however, rest assured that I am here to help as much as I possibly can - and will, along with Caryll and Lynn, hold the fort for as long as I am here! I am always around for a cup of tea, a chat, to pray with, to answer questions, and to help with the practicalities of church and community life. An interregnum is not a pause in Gods work, but a chapter in it. With faith an unity, we can look forward to the future with hope!

THE GARDEN IN SEPTEMBER

Where to start?

The weather been weird this year. Early quite hard frosts then mild or hot with very little rain. A real shortage of rain in fact. In spite of this has been a year of flowers and bumper crops of fruit.



My gooseberries, blackcurrants, blackberries and plums have all been exceptional, The tomatoes in my greenhouse have struggled a bit with the heat,

but I am getting more than I can eat. The freezer is already full, so it looks like jam and chutney recipes need researching.

The following advice assumes that the weather does broadly what it should do!

Lawns: Grass has struggled this year. At the end of June, it looked dead. Now (early August) with a small amount of rain it is quite lush. This is a good month to repair damage to lawns or to plant completely new ones from seed when the ground is still warm and moist (hopefully) and the temperatures are unlikely to reach extremes in either direction (who knows!). Keep new grass moist and give a cut towards the end of October with the blades of the mower set high.

Pruning: Prune buddleia hard when it finishes flowering. Prune summer-fruiting raspberries and blackberries.

Hedges: Give evergreen hedges a final light trim.

Cuttings: Take semi hard cuttings of evergreen shrubs and trees and shrub roses.

Plant: Plant or move evergreen shrubs, trees and hedging later in the month. Keep watered if necessary.

Perennials: Keep dead headed (unless you are leaving seeds for the birds) and cut down any dead stems. Plant new perennials. They will grow away well with the warm soil and autumn rains (?)

Dahlias: Keep dead headed. Water if necessary and check your supports – we can get some strong winds in September.

Hardy Annuals: Sow in a cold frame or greenhouse over the next couple of months ready to plant out in March. Prick out when large enough to handle.

Biennials: such as foxglove, hollyhock and forget me nots can be planted out so that they get a good start next year.

Bulbs: Plan daffodils. Pot up daffodil and hyacinth bulbs for indoor flowering. Prepared hyacinths can

be planted in pots in a dark cool place for Christmas flowering. Bring into a **cool** bright place when the shoots are about 2 inches (5cms) high. Do not put in full sun or a centrally heated room or they will stretch and grow leggy.

Strawberries: A good time to increase strawberry stock, put small pots of compost next to your plants and peg down one runner into each. These will root quite quickly, then cut off runner and pot on.

Vegetables: You can still sow radishes and winter spinach. Plant out spring cabbage plants towards the end of the month. Keep tomatoes and chillies in the greenhouse well-watered. They will keep ripening well into October if looked after. Harvest what is ready

Pots and tubs: Keep well-watered. Plant some bulbs in small pots which can then be planted on into tubs when you remove the summer bedding.



Daffodils and Tulips can be planted remarkably deep in a tub leaving plenty of space at the tops for planting for Spring flowering colour, (bellis, pansies

and primulas all do well). It is too early to plant Tulips in the ground.

Stop feeding potted plants to reduce the risk of winter frost damage. This reduces the amount of soft new growth which is more likely to be injured in a cold winter.

Remove any saucers from under containers, check drainage holes if possible, and lift the pots onto feet, or raise onto bricks with spaces below the drainage holes. This will prevent waterlogging if nature decides to make up for the lack of rain in spring and summer.

Wildlife: Some birds use nest boxes to roost over winter. Take them down and rinse out with hot water. Allow to dry out before putting back up. Line with dry grass or straw to make them warmer for small birds.

Leave some seed heads in place to provide an energy rich food source.



Leave fallen apples for the birds – if it is a cold winter, you may even get some interesting winter migrants.



RESPECT AND ENGAGEMENT ARE KEY

Across the country we have seen political turmoil for the past decade, from Brexit and the pandemic to the UK's shortest serving Prime Minister and a disastrous minibudget.

While some may like being the loudest voice, others are quietly doing the real work that benefits our local communities.

Each of the villages in my constituency is unique with its own set of challenges and opportunities, and so often it is the Parish Council that binds a community together. As MP, supporting and advocating for Parish Councils, and joining-up national and local services is a key focus of mine.

I recently hosted two work experience students, and something I highlight to everyone who has an interest in politics, whether you're a student or someone later in life – if you want to get involved in your local area, start by joining your local Parish Council. There are plenty of vacancies, so please do look into joining.

THE HISTORY OF NORFOLK ORCHARDS

Thanks to Tony Fry

As we enter the season of mellow fruitfulness I thought the following taken from Norfolk magazine October 2016 by Clare Stimson might be of interest.

Fruit trees have been a part of the Norfolk landscape since at least the Norman Conquest. The county's earliest record of fruit orchards appears in the foundation charter of Castle Acre Priory of about 1089. By 1662, when Thomas Fuller described Norwich as,

"either a city in an orchard, or an orchard in a city, so equal are houses and trees blended in it".

Fruit growing was widespread. Large-scale commercial orchards arrived with the coming of the railways in the 19th century. These were concentrated in two areas of the county, in the west, centred on the town of Wisbech, and in the east, on the Broadland rivers of the Waveney, Bure and Ant. Gaymers Cider Works in Banham and later Attleborough, was also a large consumer of Norfolk apples. However, by the late 20th century the UK fruit-growing industry was in decline due to cheaper imports and a lack of

government support. By 2006 Norfolk's orchard acreage had been reduced to around 14pc of its 1950 level.

As the older orchards disappeared, so did the range of local varieties and the wildlife associated with traditionally-managed orchards. In 1994 a group of enthusiasts set up the Norfolk Orchards Project to raise awareness of the county's fruit heritage. By 2003 this group had developed into a charity - the East of England Apples and Orchards Project - still based in Norfolk but working across seven counties in the east of England. Still run largely by volunteers, it has been surveying and saving orchards, re-discovering lost varieties, encouraging the planting of new orchards and making sure the skills to manage them are passed

In 2012 the group established the East of England Fruit Collection at its headquarters near Fakenham. This contains more than 270 varieties of apple, pear, plum and cherry whose origins lie in the region, ensuring their safety for the future. The charity sells all these varieties, ensuring everyone can share in this unique heritage, with half of its sales each year going to schools and community groups. Tree sales also fund much of the charity's work.

Nearly 50 of these varieties (37 apples, two pears and 10 cherries) originate in Norfolk, offering an astonishing range of flavours and uses.

If this autumn you are thinking of planting some fruit trees perhaps consider some heritage varieties and contact the Norfolk Orchards Project.

Breakfast: Greek yoghurt with berries and a spoon of oats or seeds

Snack: Apple with peanut butter or a boiled egg

Lunch: Grilled chicken or tofu salad with olive oil dressing

Snack: Carrot sticks and hummus

Dinner: Baked salmon, sweet potato, and steamed greens **Drinks**: Water, black coffee or tea, her bal infusions

Exercise Made Easy

You don't need to live in the gym. Start with this simple weekly routine:

3 x 30-minute walks – brisk enough to raise your heart rate

2 x strength sessions – bodyweight exercises like squats, push-ups, planks

1 x stretch or yoga day – for flexibility and joint health

Even 15–20 minutes a day can transform your mood, metabolism, and motivation.

The Long Game: Health as a Lifestyle

Being healthy isn't a punishment—it's freedom. It means climbing stairs without puffing, chasing kids (or dogs) without collapsing, and ageing with grace, not groans. Combine regular activity with sensible eating, and you'll not only look better—you'll feel unstoppable. So, skip the gimmicks. Eat real food. Move your body. Sleep well. <u>Laugh often</u>. You've only got one life—make it a long and healthy one.
