

Dear friends

One of the great privileges that I have as a Priest is to meet with people, to listen to them when times are tough, or when they are trying to work things out, and to do what little I can to help. Obviously. I would rather that everyone's life was all plain sailing ... but in a world where that rarely, if ever, happens, it is wonderful to be able to sometimes offer some help.

Recently I met with someone going through a really tough time ... something has happened in his family life that affects him, his children, his work life – absolutely everything. But he said to me that I hear so often, that I'm almost always expecting it now ... 'Well, there are other people out there who have it tougher than me.'

He's right, of course. His troubles may well be much easier to bear than someone else's. But this isn't a competition. Your burden is your burden, and it's mostly irrelevant what other people are bearing. Importantly, though, facing reality is nearly always the first step to not only coping, but thriving. Naming, acknowledging, accepting that this present moment really is awful is the first step to really dealing with it, and journeying through it, and past it. Of course, what is usually happening is that people don't want to wallow in misery – and that's entirely right and wise. But facing the truth, however hard that might be, is always the right thing.

From a Christian point of view, I've heard it said that God never gives us more than we can handle. I don't think I agree with that. My own experience has taught me that life frequently hands me things I can't handle ... but the one who can handle all things is always with me. Bereavement, sickness, divorce ... all of these things could have broken me; but knowing that Jesus is with me in every single situation has always given me the strength and hope to press on.

The miracle here is that Jesus is with you too. The task is to turn to him, to open our heart to him, to place into his hands the things our hands can't grasp. This isn't magic – there's no sudden flash of light or solution (or rarely there is). It is awakening to the presence of God within each one of us, who will walk alongside us every day, shining love, joy, peace, hope and faith into our lives, whatever the day brings. I pray that you would come to know this for yourself – and am always available to share more of the wonderful truth about Jesus with you at any time.





WHAT'S YOUR CARBON **FOOTPRINT?**

The wildfires in Los Angeles have brought vividly and tragically to the front of our

minds the effect of increasing temperatures on our planet. Worldwide governments, scientists and institutions are thinking of ways to slow this down. You might think that it is too big to think about or 'not our problem' but each of us can make some small decisions that collectively can make a difference.

It's not easy to make a start and we want to know that changes we think will make a difference actually do. One way is to do a personal carbon audit and find out your own personal carbon footprint. This is the amount of greenhouse gases - most often, carbon dioxide - released into the atmosphere as a result our lifestyle. Calculating the carbon footprint is a complex task and there are several methods and calculators that have been created over the years. This month in church we will be calculating our carbon footprint and setting ourselves one or two goals to improve our score.

You can do your own carbon footprint online - 2 easy ones to access are www.footprint.wwf.org.uk or www.carboncalculator.climatehero.org

Individuals can lower their carbon footprint in a variety of ways including eating less meat, taking fewer flights and line drying clothes rather than using a tumble dryer.

A hundred mile journey starts with a single step.

HOW WELL DO YOU KNOW RECYCLING LABELS?

If you're at a large event, such as a festival or sports match, where compostable plastics mixed with food waste can all be gathered together in a particular bin and disposed of at large scale, compostable products such as cups, plates and cutlery have a place. Food waste and compostable crockery can be collected together, processed and broken down organically.

However, this isn't an option when it comes to your council-run household recycling. Also, what's worse is that compostable packaging added to plastic recycling bins can clog up machinery and break it. The only real household-waste option for compostable packaging is putting it into your general waste bin.

The exception to this is packaging that carries the home compost logo (below left), which is not the same as the seedling logo (below right). It's most likely to be found on compostable caddy liners. Items with this symbol can go into your garden compost or council food-waste collection (as a caddy liner) - but should still never go into your plastic recycling.





WHICH asked 1097 members in July 2022 about the different packaging symbols and found 48% thought the green dot logo (see left) meant something can be recycled. (it actually means manufacturer has complied with packaging waste legislation but has nothing

to do with the packaging's recyclability).

32% of people thought the compostable seedling logo meant packaging was recyclable when in compostable products contaminate recycling. best label to look for is the On-Pack Recycling Label (OPRL; examples below). This collection of labels is becoming increasingly used on packaging in the UK. They're some of the clearest available in terms of letting

people know what they can do with the item in question.

For packaging to carry the OPRL green 'recycle' label, 75% or more of UK local authorities must collect and effectively recycle it. That means if you know your local authority has particularly strict recycling conditions they may not take it, but the majority will.

If the packaging is labelled 'don't recycle', it means fewer than 50% of local authorities collect it. It's still worth familiarising yourself with exactly what is and isn't accepted for your area. You can enter your postcode into the Recycle Now website to see what your council allows. It used to be very difficult for people to recycle plastic bags and wrapping, and while kerbside collection is still limited to a small number of councils (12% of UK councils in 2023 according to RECOUP), most supermarkets now offer a front-of-store recycling service for this packaging. Some also accept pet food and baby food pouches and salad bags. Or you can try specific store schemes such as the Pets at Home pet food pouch recycling.



This packaging logo indicates that the item can be recycled but may not be dealt with by your local council so cannot be recycled Some plastic wrapping is now labelled with this logo and a notice which tells consumers not to recycle at home but to 'recycle with bags at large

supermarkets'. Other soft plastic bags and wraps may not carry the label yet, but are still likely to be recyclable at supermarket collection points, so it's worth checking to see whether your local supermarket has a collection.



The seedling logo actually indicates that the packaging is compostable but only in industrial composters and certainly not in your home compost. At home you should put items

bearing this symbol in general rubbish and not in recycling.



This symbol has nothing to do with recycling it simply indicates the type of plastic the packaging is made from.

Please Do Not 'Wishcycle" Putting things that can't be recycled - especially batteries - in the recycling bin can cause serious problems. Recycle glass, paper and textiles at designated drop off points at supermarkets and recycling centres. Lithium-ion batteries are a particularly bad problem. At least 250 fires are started every year by 'zombie batteries' in recycling or waste management facilities causing plant shutdown and endangering lives.

Batteries in power tools, children's toys, smartphones and tablets should all be disposed of properly at a local council recycling centre. You can also find local battery recycling points at www.takecharge.org.uk.

THE GARDEN IN FEBRUARY

I am writing this in mid-January on a day of freezing fog. All the grass and trees are covered in ice crystals making everywhere look magical.

Of course, this is what the weather is supposed to do at this time of year, and is a great friend to gardeners. Hopefully, many of the overwintering pests (bugs and slugs particularly) will have their numbers brought down to more sustainable levels.

The downside is the effect on small wildlife such as voles and birds. Keep feeding the birds and do make sure they have access to non-frozen water.

Snowdrops and aconites: If you are lucky enough to have clumps of Snowdrops, wood anemone, English bluebells and aconites, they should be flowering from late January onwards. When they finish flowering is a good time to split them and plant them "in the green" — far more successful than planting dry bulbs and rhizomes in the autumn.



Perennials: Remove dead material before new growth starts. Split established plants and plant new ones.

Notes:

- a) small plants from garden centres establish better and grow faster than large ones.
- b) Look around the village there are several stalls outside houses selling surplus plants at a fraction of the garden centre prices.
- c) Don't forget the garden club plant sale in May!

Dahlias: Tubers are now available in garden centres. These can be planted in large pots in a frost-free greenhouse. Don't store packs in dry centrally heated rooms for more than a few days.

Sweet peas: Sow in pots in a cold greenhouse or cold frame. Soak seeds in water overnight (no longer) before sowing.

Annuals: Not until next month

Vegetables: Most packets of open pollinated seeds contain far more than you need. If resealed and kept cool and dry most seeds will remain viable for several years (not parsnips).

Sow in a heated greenhouse or on a warm windowsill:

Peppers, chillis aubergines and cucumbers which all need a long growing season for best cropping and wrinkled peas.

Sow in a cold frame or unheated greenhouse:

Broad beans, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, radishes and salad onions

Sow outdoors when ground is not frozen or waterlogged:

Parsnips, round seeded peas and summer spinach

Plant: early potatoes (towards the end of the month), garlic and new rhubarb crowns.

Chit: second early and main crop potatoes - place potato tuber upright in an egg box, in a light, airy, frost-free place such as an unheated room. If you chit your potatoes in a heated room this will speed up the process, but beware, unless your ground outside is similarly warm when you plant them, your potatoes will sulk!

Lawns: So long as the soil is not frozen this is a good month to lay turf so that it has time to produce a good root system ready for summer. (Wait until April to sow seed).

Hedges: If you haven't already, cut deciduous hedges hard to promote new growth before birds start building nests.

Pruning: Prune bush roses hard to outward facing buds. If you haven't done already prune apples and pears.

Houseplants: get dusting and may be wash with a little rain water from your water butt.



The good news is that I am now able to read books, in the initial stages I wasn't at all, very long days. Thankfully reading books is the thing I love doing, my husband is very keen to hear this.

A mixed bunch this time around, but I hope you get to read new books as I have done.

My Last Supper by Jay Rayner

Jay Rayner is one of those personalities you either really like or really don't. I really like him; he makes me laugh and that's a good thing these days. You would think this book would be really depressing, but it is not at all. It makes you think about life from someone else's perspective, good to do sometimes. Put yourself in their shoes. There is a lot of discussion about food and what to do choose, the ending is most certainly interesting, not what you expect, definitely worth reading.

The Trial by Rob Rinder

This book was one of the books in the book group I attend in Thetford, c/o U3A, worth going to btw. I had never read any of this author's books before, it's a slightly tricky read in a way as it deals with legal terms, an area I know very little about. Switching off and taking time to be present in nature by listening to birdsong can be very therapeutic. Open a window or go outside and listen for a Robin singing its heart out. They are one of the birds that you are most likely to hear singing at this time of year. Birds sing to mark their territories and to attract a mate, and their singing is a great reminder that spring is on its way and with it the promise of nesting, chicks and renewal. Watch for signs of spring

Nature is constantly changing. Noticing the changes can help connect us with seasons, making us feel closer to the world around us. Take a look at our Springo Bingo activity for some inspiration on what to look out for. Phenology is the study of seasonal events in nature, especially in relation to the impact climate has on timings. You can help scientists monitor the effects of climate change on wildlife by recoding your sightings on the Woodland Trust's Nature's Calendar

Gardening for wildlife

Plan a window box if you don't have a garden, or putting up a bird feeder or a window feeder can all make a difference to the local birdlife.


