



Plough Sunday is an ancient celebration revived by the Victorians. It provides us with an opportunity to reflect on the work of our farmers and for the village communities to come together to pray for them. Traditionally it is celebrated on the first Sunday after Epiphany. In the Medieval period, when there was only one plough in each village, the village plough was brought into church for a blessing before ploughing began on Plough Monday, the first working day after the 12 days of Christmas. As crucial stewards of the nation's precious food producing landscape, farmers continue to be supported by their local Village communities and agricultural associations.

Friends and neighbours

I don't know about you, but I love winter ... or at least I do until we get to January. Up until the New Year, it's all bright lights and getting ready to celebrate. But then, everything changes.

I heard a story once about an American Bishop, walking down the street in New York on Boxing Day ... to his astonishment, he nearly lost an eye as a Christmas tree was jettisoned from an apartment above him. Christmas Day had happened – and now it was back to normal, in the frozen darkness of winter.

However, in the Christian faith, Christmas (which lasts for twelve days, beginning, not ending with Christmas Day) leads into Epiphany, when we celebrate the visit of the Wise Men, the Baptism of Christ, and on into February, the Feast of Candlemas, when we recall the child Jesus, forty days after his birth, being presented at the Temple in Jerusalem. Here the prophet Simeon recognises him as the Messiah, and calls him the Light to illuminate everybody.

Along with the natural darkness, many of us feel the gloom in our own lives. But the Light that shines in every darkness is always with us, on Christmas Day, on Candlemas, and on that grey, rainy Tuesday in January when it just feels a bit much. Sometimes it's a tiny, flickering light, and even those of us most acquainted with finding it have to look really hard to see it. But the Light is always there.

I hope that this New Year, this dim and dingy January, with darkness all around us in the world, you will find that Light, Light that will guide your every footstep, Light that will warm your heart, Light that will always lighten the way home.



THE GARDEN IN JANUARY



More than most months January gardening is very weather determined.

Over recent years long very cold spells have become less

common, while prolonged wet periods are becoming the norm. Walking on the soil when it is waterlogged can cause excessive compaction which makes it harder for air and water to get through the top layer.

If the soil is reasonably dry and frost free there are many jobs that can usefully carried out this month.

1. <u>Shrubs and young trees</u> After the very strong winds of the autumn these may have rocked about, and need the soil firming around them, and possibly staking. It is a good time to tidy up and remove dead and damaged wood.

Move deciduous trees and shrubs that are in the wrong place.

Plant bare rooted deciduous trees, bushes and hedges (including fruit tees and bushes).

Deciduous hedges can be cut hard to encourage new growth before the birds start nesting towards the end of February.


- 2. <u>Dahlias</u> If you dug and stored your dahlia tubers, bananas or cannas they should be checked and use a fungicide if needed.
- 3. <u>Potatoes</u>. If you have space in a cool room to spread out some seed potatoes it is worth buying a few to have a better choice of varieties. Cardboard egg boxes/ trays are ideal for spreading them out. Don't leave them in their plastic bags, and certainly not in the dark. Planting under fleece in cold greenhouse late February, outdoors not until mid March onwards.
- 4. <u>Bulbs</u> Bring last pots of Hyacinths and other bulbs indoors to force early flowering don't subject to excessive heat or over water or they will stretch and become leggy.

Lilies can be planted indoors for an early display under glass or in the house.

5. <u>House plants</u> Remove faded flowers and leaves. Do not over water. Give plenty of light, but don't leave behind curtains at night, even with double glazing it can get very cold.

Keep indoor cyclamen healthy by placing in a bright, cool room. When the compost is dry, stand the pot in water for about 20 minutes until the top is slightly moist. Remove damaged leaves and dead flowers regularly.

6. <u>Fruit Trees</u> Continue winter pruning (not cherries, apricots, peaches or plums which are subject to fungal diseases if open wounds are left).



- 7. <u>Blackcurrants</u> Start pruning towards the end of the month. Cut out approximately a third of the old branches including any that are trailing along the ground
- 8. **Vegetables** Keep harvesting
- 9. <u>Sweet peas</u> Sow in a cool but frost free greenhouse. Sow in deep pots or old toilet roll middles. Keep moist but not wet.
- 10 <u>General</u> Clear paths of algae and moss. Clean and sharpen tools.
- 11. <u>Birds</u> Scrubbing bird feeders with a mild disinfectant and hot water occasionally can help prevent the spread of bird flu. Feed with fat-rich food.

Top up your bird feeders and fill up your water containers so that you are ready for the Big Garden Bird Watch see page 10.

IMPROVING ACCESS TO GP SERVICES

On the doorstep during the general election period one of the main issues discussed was access to a GP. To many it feels like they cannot get an appointment and are forced to fight against the "8am scramble". These experiences were not uncommon.

According to the most recent NHS data, 124,101 people in Norfolk and Waveney waited for two weeks or more, with 70 per cent of surgeries above the national average of 1,721 patients per GP due to the lack of funding.

My number one campaign priority during the election was health and social care. During the campaign I spoke to a number of residents around East Harling and Garboldisham about GP services and visited a session in Kenninghall Village Hall with Healthwatch Norfolk.

Amongst all of the health and social care related concerns it was GP services specifically in this corner of South West Norfolk that took priority. Since taking office in July the new Government has begun to tackle the issue and the backlog announcing more than 1,000 newly qualified GPs will be recruited thanks to government action to remove red tape currently preventing surgeries from hiring doctors.

The government have asked NHS England to start collating 'examples of best practices' in general practice, as the objective of this review is to 'reduce bureaucracy through a rapid review of the issues'.

The bureaucracy review will focus around five groups, which will cover:

- Medicines and prescribing
- Data, digital and technology
- Workforce, training and education
- Contractual and financial flows
- Metrics

Also, the Health Secretary has struck a deal with the Junior Doctors. Since December 2022, a variety of NHS worker groups have taken industrial action, which has caused the NHS to postpone 1.5 million consultations, procedures, and operations at an estimated cost of over £3 billion which will now stop additional pressure that has been put on our general practitioners.

This is the beginning towards shifting the focus of healthcare out of hospitals and into the community to "fix the front door to the NHS". I will continue to lobby the Government on this issue to improve access to GP services for residents in Kenninghall and surrounding areas.



TALES OF OLD HARLING 21. David Bailey. A little light on the dark ages. A.D. 400---1068.

For over 5,000 years there have been four small farming communities nestling within the protective bends of the River. Thet Since the stone ages these four communities were connected to each other by the River, by a trackway we now call the West Harling Road and later by two Roman roads*. When the Roman army, left our shores in the early 5th century to defend their homelands, history tells us that our country was invaded by waves of Germanic tribes—Jutes, Angles, Saxons and Vikings. Over the next 600 years or so these peoples transformed our country, giving us the English language and the bases of many of our laws. Even though Christianity was gaining a firm foothold in Britain at this time, surprisingly little in the way of written records survive, it is why this era is known as The Dark Ages and why this vacuum of knowledge was often substituted with myths and legends. To understand what happened to our four small riverside communities during these troubled times, we have to turn to records written 600 years later and, more reliably, the study of their placenames, surviving landscape features and some archaeology. So, what IS known about our four riverside communities during these years? They had no names as yet and we had to wait until 1086 when the Domesday book revealed them collectively as THE HERLINGAS. Today they are East Harling Middle Harling. West Harling and Harling Thorpe. After the Roman army returned to Rome in 410 A.D. it left the Herlingas' in a very vulnerable position. There was a constant threat of invasion from the directions of the Rivers Thet and Little Ouse or from both of the now undefended Roman roads—leaving wide-open flanks in all directions. A dangerous situation! Sometime during this period of threat all able bodied men, women and children of the 'Herlingas' joined forces with those from neighbouring villages, and with much sweat and toil built a pallisaded bank and ditch between the two rivers to plug the gaps. It was an incredible feat of achievement and co-operation. A small sec

The earliest surviving written records that may enlarge our story date from 1046 and c.1050 where EAST Harling is called HERUNGHAM and HERUNGE respectively. More information followed a few years later in 1086 when each of the four HERUNGAS were assessed for taxation purposes in the Domesday book. There are five entries, two for East Harling and one each for West, Middle and Harling Thorpe (continued overleaf on page 16) not mentioned by name until 1254 as 'Herling Media'). The fact that East Harling has two entries does not mean it was any bigger or more important, the manor assigned to Middle Harling had FOUR 'carucates' of land and the other three manors had only five between them.

A 'carucate' is a medieval term for the amount of land a plough team could till in an annual season--approximately 120 acres. Clearly, from this and other evidence East Harling had not yet become the biggest of the 'Herlings'. In a conflicting Domesday entry East Harling is recorded as having a Church!** Does this mean the others did not? Or that there were more Christian converts living in East Harling rather than more people? Each entry is frustratingly brief, so we will never know. This earlier church, undoubtedly built of wood and daub, would almost certainly have stood on the same prominent site as the one today, enjoying the security of a bend in the River against Viking raiders. Again, we will never know as evidence of its existence would have disappeared when the present magnificent stone-church was built over it a couple of hundred years later.

A closer look at the place-name HERLINGAS may give more clues about its origins. The suffix '--ingas'

in a place-name is Anglo-Saxon and, controversially, taken to mean' the people of '--, with a personal name added accordingly. 'The Herlingas' thus becomes The People of Herla. There was a mythological King of the Britons called Herla in Germanic-Saxon legend but presumably our Herla was real--and a local tribal leader-- but there is no evidence of his existence. This is not to belittle this explanation, I'm only suggesting that it should not stop us from considering an alternative origin of our place-name which I offer here as The People Of The Misty Lake*. Allow me to elaborate:-Prominent features in the local landscape were also incorporated into ancient place-names, like many Welsh villages today, but whilst we don't have any mountains, ravines or waterfalls near Harling, we DO have a few landscape features which 1,500 years ago were dramatic and prominent enough to define its location and potentially explain our place-name. Again, allow me to elaborate:- Each of the four ancient Harlings were situated around the edge and just above the flood plains of the River Thet, which often flooded to create a large shallow LAKE about two miles long and half a mile wide. It has silted up now, but its waters are not far below the boggy surface. It is an inaccessible area today and its eastern edge is now called Black Carr. In the middle of this damp and marshy landscape there is a HILL -high enough to be an island when the lake formed. On top of this hill are the remains of two Iron Age roundhouses, where our ancestors lived 2,000 years ago. It is called Micklemoor Hill*. Today frequent morning and night-time banks of FOG creep across this ancient flood-plain, people who live in that area now and who witness this phenomena from their gardens along the West Harling Road, describe it as "mysterious" -- "spooky" -- " beautiful, especially at sunset!". Our Dark Age ancestors would have experienced exactly the same fear and the same beauty when the same sun slipped down across their Lake. Why would they not not have included a reference to this impressive event within the name of the place that defined them? What's the evidence? Maybe some of the following Old-English words within the place name HERLINGAS, along with some imagination, could translate as The People Of The Misty Lake?

Bearing in mind local dialect forms with no spelling rules. Haar or Harl = FOG (sea fog or fog over open water). Ingas = THE PEOPLE OF.-- Lyng = BANK or RIVER TERRACE. e.g The origins of Lyng, Norfolk (the village. Lynn / Lin(g) (as derivatives of Llyn) = LAKE, (e.g the origins of Kings Lynn i.e. Kings 'Lake'). I first proposed this theory some decades ago in talks and elaborated on it in a Contact article*.

Finds of Saxon pottery sherds from the later dark ages have been found in the plough-soil at Middle,

West Harling and Thorpe. Unfortunately all evidence of Saxon occupation in EAST Harling is hidden beneath its streets and houses. Soon after Saxon times the higher lands of EAST Harling became a more popular place in which to live and farm, consequently the focus of occupation shifted uphill and away from the damper lands. By 1350 the population decline was serious and by the 17th century these three communities were almost deserted. That's another story, but can explain why there is little evidence of Saxon history in EAST Harling.

An appeal to readers of this article, please keep an eye open for anything you find that looks ancient---especially any shards of unglazed pottery. I found two rims of a large 10th century cooking vessel about a metre down whilst digging the foundations for the porch on our cottage in White Hart Street so the evidence is there, it just needs to be recognised.

A small archaeological dig was carried out in the area of West and Middle Harling during the early 1980's. It showed this area had enjoyed continuous but small-scale occupation for 5,000 years. Occupation during the Dark Ages was shown from finds of late-Saxon pottery which re enforced the Domesday entries. Some coins from the middle Saxon period were also discovered which, importantly, changed some ideas about the territorial frontiers of the three middle Saxon Kings among whom the kingdom of East Anglia was divided in the mid-eighth century. Some medieval ditches were found that ran northwards from the site towards the area of the seasonal Lake which would be tempting to think were built as moorings for shallow bottomed fishing boats, but this remains unproven. Slots and post holes showed evidence of a small building here of middle Saxon date---but the excavation was too small to determine its purpose.

Some people reading this may recall that some pits were found containing numerous disarticulated bones. Assumptions followed that these were "Plague Pits". The bad news is that they were found to be re-buried skeletons disturbed from a nearby cemetery whilst digging for chalk in the 19th century, proved by the discovery of a VICTORIAN BUTTON at the very bottom of the pit!

AQUAFABA (CHICKPEA WATER) MERINGUE



This is a great recipe which allows you to make meringue without using egg whites substituting the water from a can of chickpeas instead (called Aquafaba)

<u>Ingredients</u>

4000g can chickpeas

100g castor sugar

Method

- 1. Heat oven to 110C / Fan 90 C/ gas 1/4 and line a baking tray with baking parchment.
- 2. Drain the can of chickpeas into a large clean bowl, saving the chickpeas for a another recipe.
- 3. Using an electric whisk, beat the chickpea water until soft peaks form (similar to egg white (this takes rather longer than beating egg whites so be patient!)
- 4. Add the sugar a little at a time whisking constantly until thick and glossy. This step is crucial to helping the meringues hold their shape and you'll be whisking for up to 10mins far longer the traditional meringue
- 5. Spoon or pipe the meringue mixture over the tray in 8cm blobs. bake for 1hour 15 mins until crisp. Leave to cool then pile with cream or (soya cream great dessert for vegans) and fruit if using.


