

# **Clergy Corner**



#### Remember, Remember - the theme of November

November always seems to begin with days when we can enjoy the last of the glorious Autumn colours as the leaves slowly wither and prepare to fall; and it ends with the dark nights of winter and bleak bare branches declaring the onset of winter. November always calls us to remember too..... All Saints, All Souls, Guy Fawkes and, on Remembrance Day, all who have given their lives in war.

All Saints day falls on 1<sup>st</sup> November and in Churches around the globe, congregations will be reminded that as Christians, we are part of a great company of ordinary people who were touched by God and responded by living lives that in some way made the world a better place and gave glory to God. Saints are not just extraordinarily holy people; in the Bible we are told that all who believe are saints.

Then comes the remembrance of All Souls when we remember those we have known and loved who have gone before us. The people who have touched our lives and made a difference; and we give thanks for them remembering times spent together. (Join us to celebrate this at Soul Café in the Old School Hall on November 3<sup>rd</sup> at 6pm)

Perhaps the main focus of our remembering will be Remembrance Day.

This year marked the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the D Day landings. Many of you will have attended events in June to remember and pay tribute to those who took part in what was the largest seaborne invasion in history. Along with the associated airborne operations it marked the beginning of the liberation of France and western Europe leading to the end of the second world war.

They went with the vision of fighting to make the world a better place, 'a world fit for us all to live in'.

888,246 British and Colonial soldiers lost their lives in WW1, not to mention the millions more from other nations! 888,246 personal tragedies – each life lost devastated a whole family, often a whole community! WW1 was to have been the 'Great War to end wars' but it ended up being the precursor to WW2 in 1939. And, in the almost eighty years since WW2 we have been engaged in many more conflicts.

It is important to remember that great sacrifice, but, surely, remembering has to be coupled with a desire not to repeat the mistakes of history, and action aimed at a better world where we seek forgiveness not vengeance.

Jesus said that the second most important commandment, after loving God, is to love one another.

What does that mean for us here, in rural Norfolk? How can we make a difference in the world? Can we make any impact at all? When I was a child in Sunday School, we used to sing a chorus:

'Jesus bids us shine with a pure clear light,

like a little candle burning in the night.

In this world of darkness, so we must shine...

You in your small comer and I in mine.'

The world is a huge place, probably more turbulent in 2024 than ever before. The prospect of world peace seems overwhelmingly impossible to achieve; but, maybe, if each of us — in our own small corner - 'shines' out with the love that Jesus asks of us, together we will begin to make a difference! Isn't it worth a try?



**Borders:** the ground is warm and moist. It is a good time to dig out new beds and borders. Weed several times before planting new shrubs, trees and perennial ornamentals or fruit bushes.

Lawns: traditionally you would have cleaned and oiled your lawnmower and put it in the shed until Spring. In the last few winters however, it has stayed reasonably mild until after Christmas. If necessary, trim with the blades set high when the grass is dry.

Trees and shrubs including roses and fruit bushes: A good month to plant bare root plants – these can be purchased and planted up until early March. Stake trees to prevent rocking.

Plant deciduous hedges – bare root are available from some nurseries. My beech hedge at the front of the house and my tapestry hedge at the back were purchased mail order from Glebe Farm Hedging at Langham on the Suffolk/Essex border. Before planting soak the roots for no more than 30 minutes. You should be able to see the level they were in the soil, aim to plant at the same depth. Dig the hole about twice the width of the root spread, cover the roots loosely with soil and shake the plant to so that it settles round the roots then top up and firm in with your foot. Water and leave to Mother Nature. Check occasionally and refirm if the wind has loosened them. If like me, you are plagued with muntjac deer you may need spiral tree guards (available cheaply on the internet).

**Perennials:** Split established perennials and plant new ones. Don't let short biennials and perennials get covered by leaves.

**Dahlias:** If you have Harling "Brecks soil ""cut dahlias back, mark with a cane and forget about them. Most of them will reappear in late April or early May. If you are in one of the parishes where the ground gets waterlogged over the winter you may need to dig up the tubers, turn upside down in a dry place for a couple of days to drain off excess water, then store in damp sand or compost in a dry, frost free (not heated) place until February.

**Bulbs:** Plant tulips. Not too late to plant daffodils, they should be reduced at the garden centres by now. Check potted bulbs planted in September and move any that are ready to a greenhouse, cold frame, or well-lit cool room.

Vegetables: Harvest whatever is ready. You may need to stake taller varieties of Brussels sprouts to prevent wind damage. Protect winter/ spring brassicas from pigeons. Plant individual garlic cloves 3cm deep and 15 cm apart, check them from time to time- blackbirds have a habit of pulling them up to look for bugs!

Rhubarb: Dig up old woody crowns and split (an axe or saw may bube needed on older crowns). Make sure that each piece you are going to replant has at least one bud. Dig plenty of compost or well-rotted manure into the soil before replanting.

**Fruit trees:** Begin winter pruning of established fruit trees (not stone fruit).

**Seeds:** Start browsing the seed catalogues (paper copy or online). Be wary of listings on eBay, and if tempted check that they are from plants grown in the UK or the EU (a lot of destructive diseases, particularly of trees, have come from abroad, especially from Asia).

**Birds:** keep bird feeders stocked up with high energy food. Leave water for them. Remove netting from fruit cages to prevent birds becoming caught up in them. They will repay you by eating overwintering insects and slugs

### Smoke, air pollution and waste disposal

Our villages of East Harling, Bridgham, Larling and Brettenham all lie along the river valley of the Thet and as such are prone to low lying mists at this time of year. Because of the geographic situation this also means that any air pollution such as smoke from factory chimneys, bonfires and from household wood burning stoves and open fires are likely to "hang around" for much longer and can affect air quality quite seriously for short periods of time.

### Wood-burning stoves

Many homes have open fires or wood-burning stoves, however people may not be aware that these can contribute to air pollution and reduce indoor air quality, which can be damaging to health. Make sure that you have a carbon monoxide detector fitted in the area where the fire is as well as smoke alarms elsewhere in the home.

It is important to burn seasoned firewood only in order to reduce air pollution and improve general health. Domestic burning is one of the single biggest sources of harmful small particle air pollution in the UK!

Then of course there is the joyous celebration of the 5<sup>th</sup> November – Guy Fawkes day – when many communities have bonfires and fireworks celebrations which we all look forward to.

However, for some people the poor air quality resulting from fireworks and bonfires can be quite a challenge at this time of year. These days Firework and Bonfire parties take place over a week or so around the 5<sup>th</sup> November instead of just on the 5<sup>th</sup> as used to be the case.

### **Bonfires**

We can all make a difference by disposing of garden waste, leaves etc. not in household bonfires but at the

local tip. Bonfires produce smoke and toxic chemicals and can cause annoyance to neighbours, people with breathing difficulties, as well as a danger to animals. If you must light a bonfire, a last resort when there is no other suitable means of disposal, make sure that the material is dry before it is burnt. This makes the combustion process more effective. Check the waste to make sure there are no pressurised containers or other items that are dangerous to burn.

Do not burn materials such as household rubbish, rubber tyres, paint, foam or anything containing plastic. These should all be safely disposed of at the local tip. Norfolk county council are introducing a new booking system for all Norfolk recycling centres and from 18 November 2024 you will need a booking to visit. You can book by phone or online and up to seven days in advance, so you will be able to book from 11 November 2024.

It is also good to talk to your neighbours before having a bonfire, to avoid potential problems such as smoke blowing over clean washing or through open windows. Check the wind direction before lighting your bonfire, to make sure the smoke will blow away from your neighbours. Be extra mindful of local wildlife when lighting a bonfire. Hedgehogs in particular like to reside inside the stacks of materials bonfires are built from, so please make sure you check for any wildlife. The best way of doing this is by moving the whole bonfire by hand immediately before lighting it.

### Fireworks

The noise associated with loud fireworks can cause a great deal of distress to pets, farm animals and wildlife. Some fireworks can also have an impact on the environment, with the release of pollutants and the associated waste and falling debris leading to unnecessary litter, with the potential to cause direct harm to livestock and wildlife.

People may not be aware, but it is an offence under the Animal Welfare Act 2006 to cause unnecessary suffering to an animal, and this includes through the misuse of fireworks. Those found guilty of causing animals unnecessary suffering can face up to five years' imprisonment.

So if you are planning a home based or a community fireworks and bonfire event, make sure it is widely advertised so that people can prepare for it in advance, shutting pets away, and enabling farmers to move livestock away from the fall out zone. Make sure that there is a safe area clearly marked around the bonfire, and also ensure that the fallout zone for the fireworks is kept clear, and cleared of any litter and debris promptly. Consider quieter fireworks up to 90dB, and/or silent fireworks instead.

The best way to enjoy the Bonfire Night and Fireworks is to attend a community event such as that being held in East Harling on the Rec on the 1<sup>st</sup> November – see page 15 for more information!





### CARING FOR THE WORLD AROUND US

'But ask the animals, and they will teach you, the birds of the air, and they will tell you; ask the plants of the earth, and they will teach you, and the fish of the sea will declare to you. Who amona all these does not know that the hand of the Lord has done this? In his hand is the life of every living thing and the breath of every human being.'

In this passage, the biblical character Job speaks of the reality that humans, who often (almost always, in fact) think of themselves as the centre of the entire universe, are in fact only a part of that universe ... and in fact a part that quite often acts in ways that are harmful and destructive, and contrary to the design of its creator (Job 12.7-10).

The book of Job is part of the 'Wisdom Literature' of the Bible, along with the Psalms, the Proverbs and other books that are reflections on how to live, how to be human, how to find guidance in a world that was as bewildering then as it is now.

For a long time, the Church was as guilty as anyone of seeing the world as something to be dominated and plundered; increasingly, though, Christians, along with many others of other faiths, and of none, are awaking to the belief that we exist as part of a web of existence. Christians believe that the entire cosmos is no accident. It is something that exists because of the overflowing love of God, that is diverse and beautiful, and that is meant to come together in a rich and complex harmony of co-existence.

That we, as a race, have done and continue to do damage to our corner of this wonderful universe seems hard to deny ... but the key to dealing with it without being overwhelmed or entirely negative is to trust, with Job, that God has all things in God's hands, and that God loves all things. This means that with God, all things are possible, and every small action, along with every great change of culture, makes a difference. We affirm that the ocean is God's, and the great blue sky is God's; the sun in its brilliance, and the moon in quiet beauty. Every creature is loved by God, and so are you.

We, as a Church, are trying our little bit to love the animals, the plants, the birds, the fish, every corner of creation, and to love each other and ourselves, in making choices and decisions to honour the beauty in which we have been placed, and which our children will inherit. Not out of guilt or fear, but because God loves it all, and calls us to do the same. Whether you are a Christian or not – perhaps you are being called to be a good steward and guardian of your corner of the world too.

# LOVING EARTH EXHIBITION AND SIX INCHES OF SOIL FILM Q&A AND MARKET SESSION

The exhibition displaying 70 needlework panels finished a very successful two week run with lots of visitors. Following on from the Make and Create day on the 28<sup>th</sup> September quite a few peope had a go at making their own fabric pictures using the scraps and recycled materials provided (thank you to Jan and friends). Visitors also had a go at weaving a few strands into the loom provided by Lynn and Tony, to create a prayer mat which is now hanging in the church alongside these little panels.



The exhibition closed with the showing of the film "Six Inches of Soil" on the 7th October. The film tells the story of remarkable farmers, communities, small businesses, chefs and entrepreneurs who are leading the way to transform how our food is produced and consumed. The film follows three new farmers; Anna Jackson, a Lincolnshire 11th generation arable and sheep farmer; Adrienne Gordon, a Cambridgeshire small-scale vegetable farmer; and Ben Thomas, who rears pasture-fed beef cattle in Cornwall. As the trio of young farmers strive to adopt regenerative practices and create viable businesses, they meet seasoned mentors already engaged in regenerative farming and caring for their local environment. If you can do go and see the film, it is really interesting and inspirational.

The film was followed by a chance to meet some local food producers and also Kenninghall Food Pantry volunteers and a panel discussion with local farmers as well as Bishop Graham, lead Bishop for the Environment and Barbara Bryan, Norwich Dioscean Environmental officer. We were also treated to some delicious sausage casserole made by Revd Josh and parsnip soup made by Jan, a thoroughly enjoyable evening!


